Only a brief note to-night as I've had a long day in the trenches and want to go to bed fairly soon. Algier came over and dined with me last night,

we had our old Dix band playing which was rather nice.

What an awfully good sort he is. I like him most awfully. I'm sure he's an awfully fine man.

Little O'D is killed in the wood here & came in to see me for a few minutes this morning. He has gone off to Paris to-night for a few days leave. He was looking awfully well and in great heart.

There is going to be a fourth of June dinner at Amiens which I think we are going to, it may be rather amusing. I have got to run a demonstration here on Monday so will be rather busy the next few days. It means a good deal of arranging. I have got to work out the programme in the morning it's too late & I'm too sleepy to start on it now.

The General & T are going on leave next week. I think he goes on Tuesday but it's not settled yet. The boat leaves at 12.45 on Monday and 1.15 on Tuesday and 2pm Wednesday (French Time).

Well! I had to cease for a bit and draft my scheme for the demonstration as I want to show it to Col Fuller in the morning & now that I'm left here peacefully I thought I could do it quicker than in the morning.

I haven't had time to answer the Duchess's or Pichon's letters yet. When I do I'll send them to you.

I must be off to bed now as it's 12 o'clock and I
