

July 2.

My dear Mr. Mrs.

I wrote you a very brief scribble to-day just before I went up to the line. Our attack yesterday was unsuccessful being held up by machine guns. I can't tell you any details at present as they might be trouble if the censor got hold of it. It is ~~a~~ awfully disappointing considering the enormous amount of time and energy we expended in working out the plans. One would have thought there couldn't have been a hill. But immediately our barrage lifted onto the 2<sup>nd</sup> line the Boche had his old machine guns up and played the devil with us.

Poor old Price is killed I'm afraid and now of his Regt with him. After the battle some other time I must go into details now or I might get into trouble.

I ~~am~~ sorry at the - Did you hear that Alpine was wounded in the leg and arm but apparently not seriously.

July 3.

I had to stop last night as a lot of work came in & I didn't get done till nearly 11 o'clock & the thought it was time for bed. I am going to the 86<sup>th</sup> Bde as Bde Major. It isn't yet decided when I go, but it will most probably be to-morrow or the next day. I am going to be leaving the General but awfully bulky to fit a job like that. It means an awful lot of work, & I do hope I can do it well. I'm so perfectly anxious about things to tell as I won't be much to tell that he can really rely on me. I'm so afraid of his being disappointed in me.

Last. I had to go off to Corps this morning so will continue now. The news from the South seems good.

On 13 and 15 Corps on day will - the French have got  
a well offensively the Boche had concentrated all his  
strength against us here. The fight down south offensively  
went through quite early. It is rather surprising for us  
having struck a snag at here. Our fellows did fight so  
gallantly but they were absolutely worn down by machine  
guns. However we have the consolation of knowing that  
10 thousand Boche have fallen into our hands - that so  
many now again must have been killed.

I am going to the 86<sup>th</sup> Bde to-morrow, so  
you must mind if you don't hear from me for several  
days. As there is bound to be a useful amount of work  
to be done. I wish you might write and say how  
me little they tell the General about it. Do whatever you  
think best. But I feel that he would appreciate your  
writing to him. Yes I heard that about the Boche  
killing of a hand ~~about~~ something about ~~knowing~~  
(their knowing we were going to attack. But don't know  
when it was. I must stop now or I'll miss the boat.  
But how dear we are.
