Can you give me any information concerning my son Lieut G. D. Ammitage 11th East-Surrey attached to 2nd Hampshires reported missing on 6th Aug.

I have been told to-day by Private Paffey of the 2nd Hunts now in St. Thomas' Hospital that my son was wounded on that day. Taken down to the Dressing Station on the beach, and afterwards placed on a transport-ship wh: he believes. though he cannot say for certain. was Z.24.

I have learnt not to place too much reliance on the statements of wounded men home from the front but in my anxiety to obtain news of my

son I do not wish to leave any stone
unturned or disregard anything that
is told me.

My son was one of 16 Officers reported
missing on 6th Aug & I have been told
by others that there is very little hope
